Activity: Reading a map Get a paper map that shows your local area. Pick a place to go to via a car. My suggestion is to take your parent/teacher out to lunch. 😊 Plot a course on the map that uses a variety of side streets to get there (don't go the usual “easy” way that you may already know). Sit in the front seat of the car and navigate (give directions to the driver). Discuss: Was it easy? Was it difficult? Why should we still bother to learn how to read a paper map?
